TELLER POSITION

With Bev Rittenhouse leaving in mid-January, YEFCU has adjusted the responsibilities and job descriptions of our current staff. As a result, we will be hiring a new full-time teller, to begin work on or around January 22, 2007.

To qualify, an applicant must have a high school diploma. Further schooling would be a plus, as would previous experience in banking or credit union work, handling money, and being computer literate. Having some marketing or sales skills would be an additional asset.

YEFCU will set starting pay commensurate with education and experience. Excellent fringe benefits package and health care insurance will be provided upon completion of a 90 day probationary period.

Responsibilities will include accepting deposits and payments, cashing checks, disbursing withdrawals, preparing checks, working with IRA's, credit and debit cards, travelers checks, certificates of deposit, and answering phone calls and inquiries.

LOAN INSURANCE CHANGES

YEFCU has increased the maximum loan amount insurable under Credit Life and Disability Insurance through CUNA Mutual to \$50,000, and the maximum monthly Disability benefit to \$850, effective February 1, 2007. Also on that date rates for Disability Insurance will increase. Information regarding new rates is available from the CU, and will be provided to you upon request.
